We've Hit Water

*Praise God from whom all blessings flow.
 Praise Him all creatures here below.
 Praise Him above Ye heavenly host;
 Praise Father, Son, and Holy Ghost. Amen.*

In February, we designated that our 2010 Lenten Offering would go to the Holston Conference's efforts to provide clean water in Southern Sudan. In our January Body & Soul, we learned that until enough money could be raised to dig wells, they had found water filters could be purchased and used to filter the water that without filtering is very dirty and unsanitary. Our idea was that since at that time the cost of digging a well was \$10,000, we would try to fund a filter kit for each of the 17 church stations in Southern Sudan. The kits would cost \$75 each which would mean we would need to raise \$1275 to fund this project. We thought that was doable. It would be more than we have typically raised in our Lenten Offerings but again, we felt sure we could do it.

However, after much prayer, someone came forward and said the filters were not enough. This person believed we could do a well. Others agreed, so, we decided to go for a well. We knew it would be an ambitious task to raise \$10,000 but we had faith. We put the word out, began to pray and asked people to consider sacrificial giving to this effort. Since Lent is the season we focus on the sacrifice Christ made for us, it was a perfect tie-in to what we were asking people to do.

During Lent, we received nearly \$5000. Since then, we have learned the cost of digging the wells has been lowered to \$8100. Praise God, with the new cost figure, we have now received enough money to fund the well. We want to thank everyone who has given to make the dream of providing clean water a reality in Southern Sudan. We especially want to thank Kathy Clark who had the vision that we could go for a well. All you have done is a blessing to the people of Sudan and we hope you have also been blessed! The next time you take a drink of clean water, know you have helped someone have what we often take for granted. We've hit water!

Sitting at Jesus' Table by Tim D. Smith

Playing the part of James the Greater was a blessing, and sitting with the other disciples and in the presence of our teacher, master, and our Lord I could almost, just almost, feel for just a fleeting moment, what it might have felt like to be with Him in the flesh. I discovered that in the days and weeks leading up to the performance that if I thought long enough and dreamed hard enough that I was there, really there, I was filled with a great and immense sadness, a despair born of knowing the outcome of this supremely moving tale. And then I could only feel great joy at the realization that my Lord lives and can and will save me, despite all of my shortcomings, all of my sins, and all of my failings.

How would I view Him if He was physically there? What would I say to Him? And then it happened and I knew.

Playing the part of Jesus at the Last Supper, Jason broke the bread, washed our feet and prepared everyone in attendance for communion. I had not known Jason before our performance. I did not know his family. I only knew he was a pastor planning on moving his family where he had been called. And when those in attendance were called to dip bread into the wine, symbolic of His body and His blood, the first group in line was two children and who appeared to be their mother. But something marvelous happened. When the oldest of the children, a little girl that looked to be about five, dipped her bread and put the morsel in her mouth she immediately grasped "Jesus" behind the head pulling him to her. She locked eyes with him in the most loving exchange I have ever witnessed. She stroked his beard with her tiny open hand and held his eyes and then she smiled and simply said, "I love you."

I fought back tears. I had no idea that it was our actor's daughter. I only knew that the embrace and exchange might be the closest I would ever be to being even remotely near to witnessing the way we should all feel for our Savior. That display of unabashed, unashamed, and pure love for a father brought a flood of emotions that made me long for a closer relationship with Jesus.

I sincerely hope this blesses you just as it did me. Share in Jesus' love every day. Know that He is still here with us. Know that one day we can look into His loving eyes, remaining in His caring hands, and be the fulfillment of His promise to us.

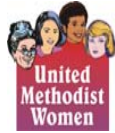
Something for Everyone

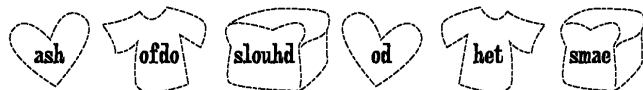

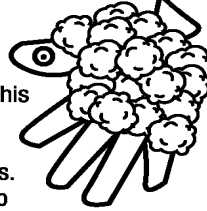

Lamb Mission Bank

God can do great things with our gifts. This craft reminds us that every little coin counts. When your lamb is full, empty out the coins and give them to a charity or church mission program.



What you need:

- Knit glove (black or white)
- 1-foot-long piece of thin ribbon, any color
- Stapler
- Craft glue or hot glue gun
- Fiberfill or cotton balls
- 2 googly eyes

What you do:

1. Staple one end of the ribbon to the inside of each side of the glove's opening to make a hanger.
2. For the lamb's body, cover the palm and half of the thumb with glue. Stick the fiberfill or cotton balls onto the glue.
3. Glue a googly eye to each side of the mitten's thumb. (The other fingers will be the legs.)
4. Hang the lamb where you'll see it often. Whenever you have extra change, drop it into your lamb bag.



We receive many different publications at the church touting stewardship ideas and programs designed to "increase" the giving patterns in our church.
